
The Academy is producing that new group of merchant marine officers who are skilled in the technology of ship operation and also in the other maritime related industries.

My sincere best wishes go with you.

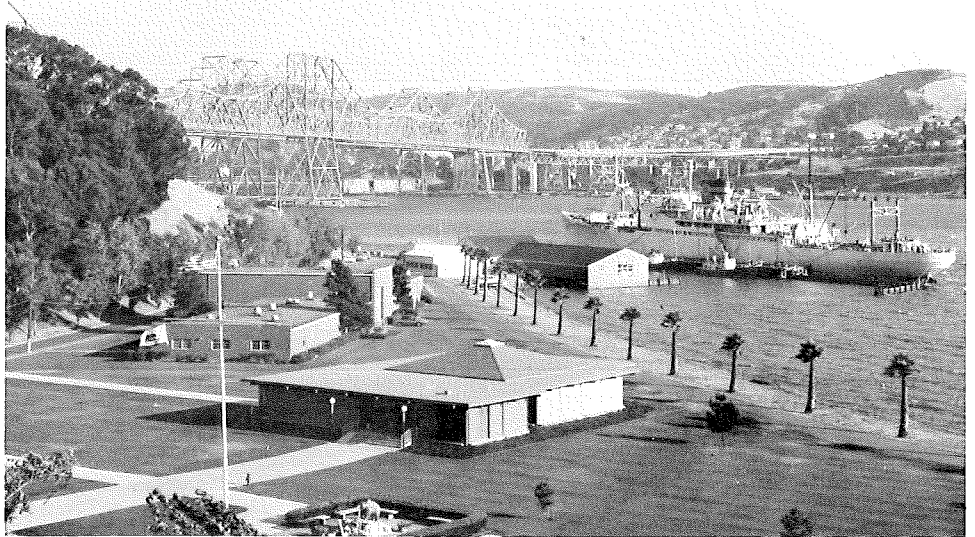

It's still true. You don't have to find out the hard way.

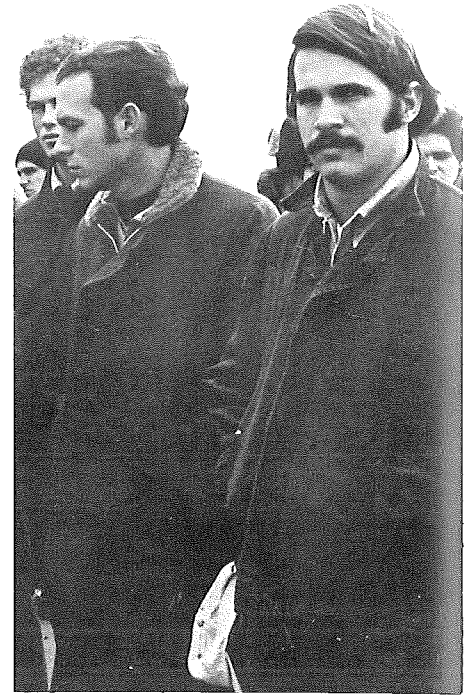
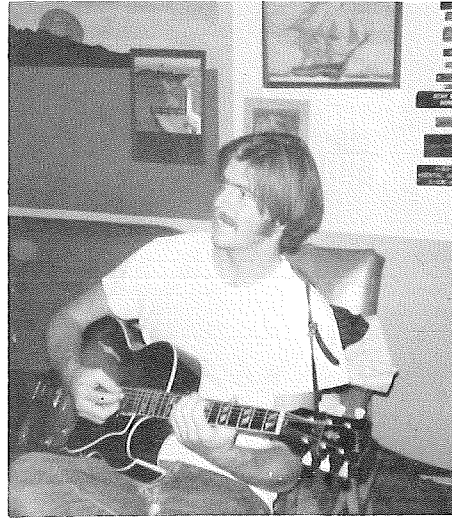

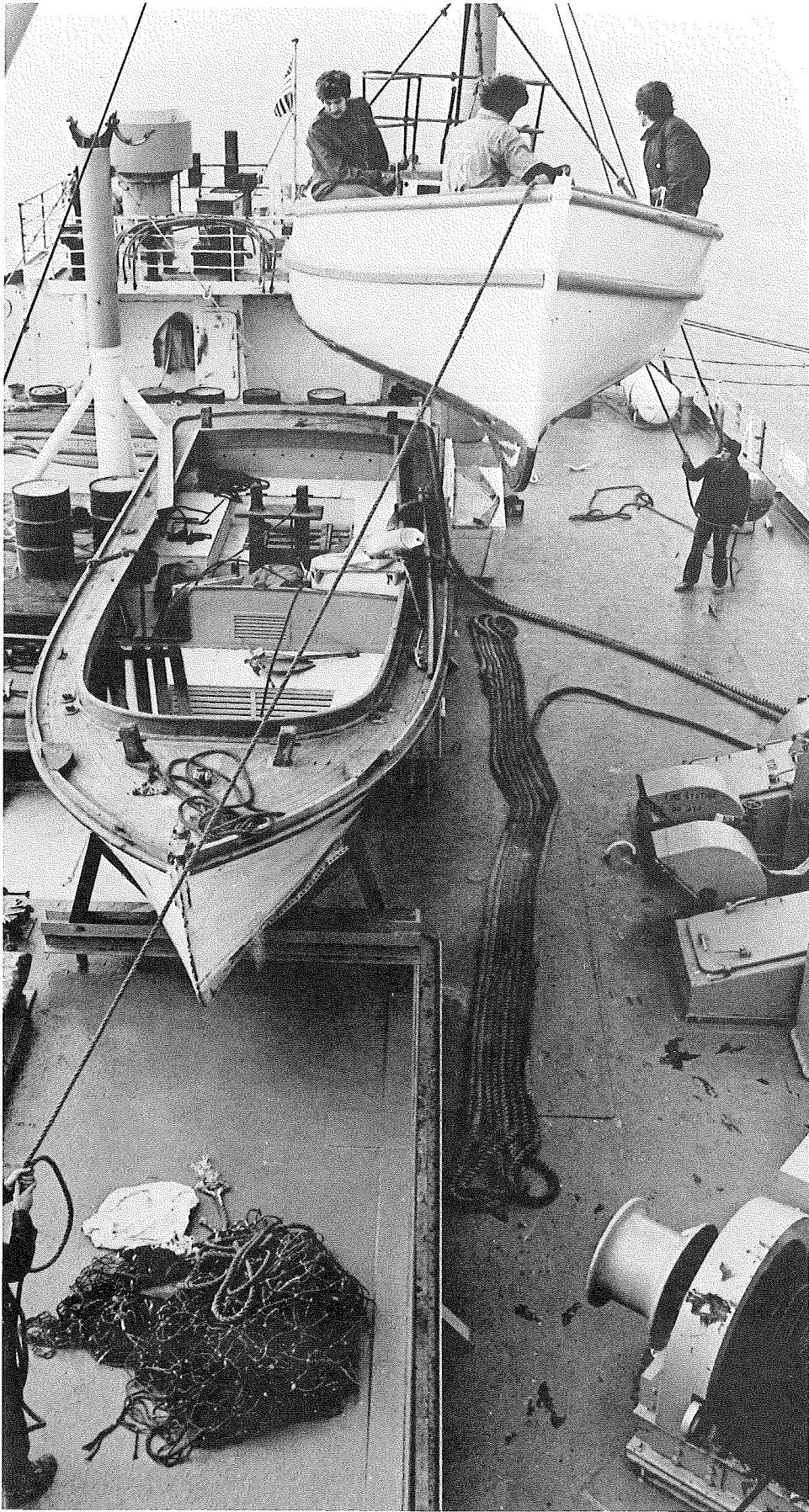
We hope you upgrade your licenses in the years to come and keep that edge of wonder and curiosity that is vital to the seaman.

For the true mariner, final satisfaction comes with the harmony of thought and action, of anticipation and response, that makes his ship an extension of his will - be it dingy or supertanker!

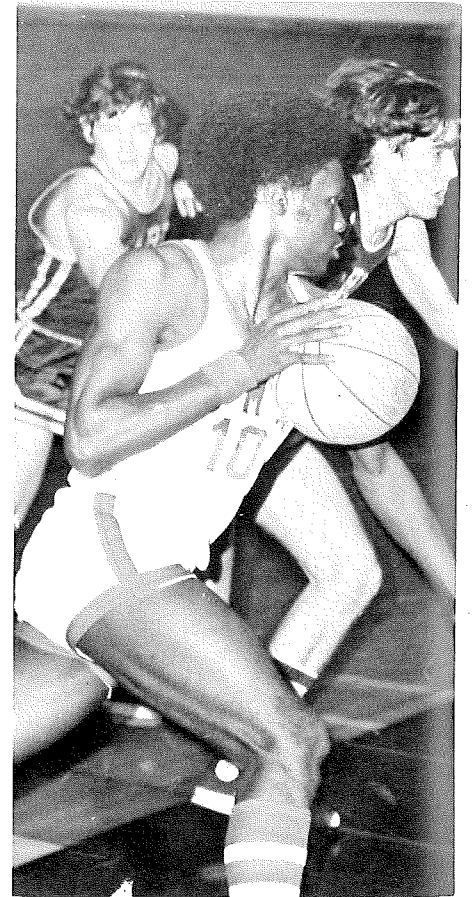
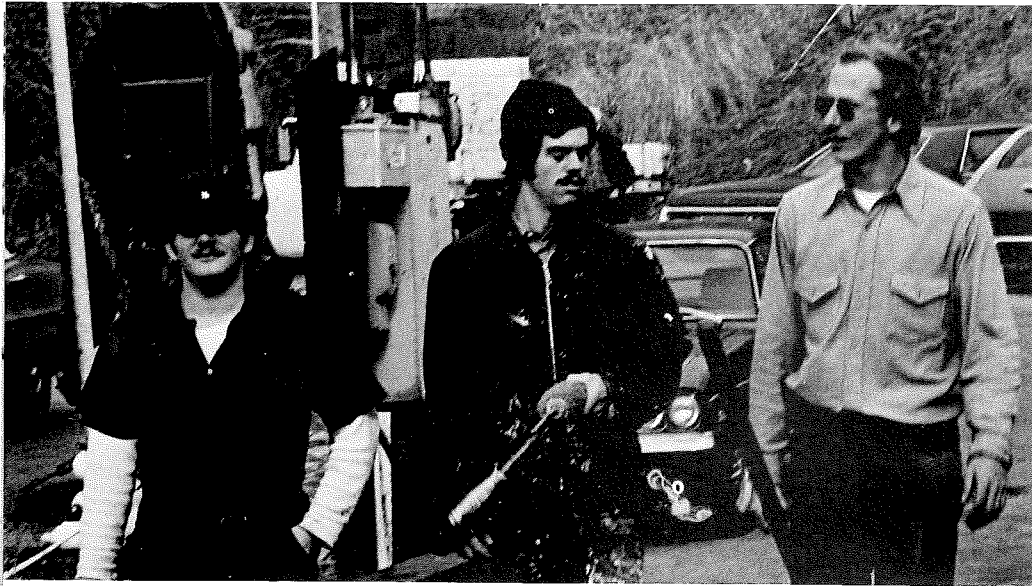
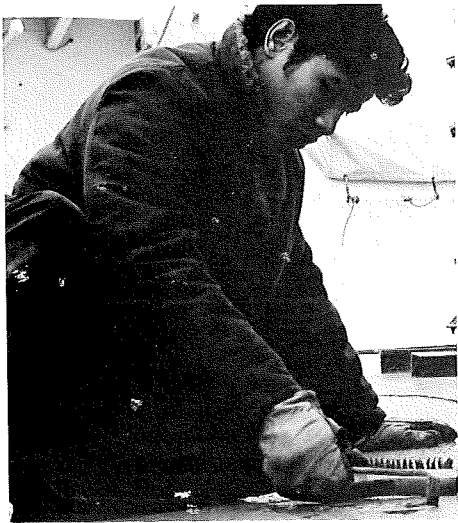
